Congregational Suggestions/Concerns:

- Life-to-Life Discipleship Small Group Discussion
 - Participants in the Life-to-Life Discipleship program feel like it has made a big difference in their spiritual and social lives.
 - They would like to bring ideas forward to encourage others to get involved with the church. For example:
 - Speak with new members and others personally to explore ways they may be able to get involved within the church.
 - Provide name cards during the Birthday Celebration for those who have a birthday that month.
 Then people can approach them and wish them happy birthday.
 - Possibly have greeters prior to the worship services again.
 - If anyone has other suggestions, please let us know.
- There is a broken window and a problem with a faucet in the Scout Hut.
- Housekeeping
 - Concerns about the housekeeping of the church have been raised especially concerning the restrooms.
 - Several members of the congregation have volunteered to help. They could do things like fill the paper towel and soap dispensers in the restrooms among other things.
 - o Pastor Cauble will speak with Regina Scronce and see if she would like some help in these areas.
- Sound system
 - When watching the service through Facebook, sometimes you can hear and sometimes you can't.
 - o Will ask Robert and Billy if it needs to be fixed or if the volume needs to be increased.

Old Business:

- Automatic Door Opener
 - Rather than using solar energy, we are going to run power from the emergency light. The quote for one door only (i.e., does not include electrical work) is \$4,389.28.
 - The electrical work shouldn't cost much since it's already wired and we are not running something new.
- Outdoor Worship Area Update
 - Our project was approved for up to \$100,000. The City of Hickory will receive the money and then reimburse us once the project is complete.
 - Danny Sorrells said his company hires an engineering firm to oversee the paperwork, permits, inspections, and everything else involved in projects like this to make sure it is done correctly. The Army Corp of Engineers worked with CVCC.
- Youth Person Search Committee
 - We have a very strong candidate in mind. She is a lay person. The Search Committee has interviewed her and then Pastor Cauble and Pastor Yoder had a follow-up interview.
 - The Search Committee is meeting Tuesday, October 17 at 7:15 in the Bollinger/Yount Room. We are looking toward moving ahead with this person. Some of the job description may change slightly.
- Parsonage Lease The new parsonage lease including the rate increase is signed.

New Business:

- Loose Offering
 - o November 5 Word of Life Lutheran Church
 - November 12 Thanksgiving Box Meals
 - November 19 Thanksgiving Box Meals
 - November 26 Thanksgiving Box Meals
- Lutheran World Relief Involvement
 - Lutheran World Relief will not be supported by the NALC anymore because they are receiving government money.
 - There are opportunities during the year to send items to the NC NALC Disaster Response Fund through the Carolinas Mission Region of the NALC. Categories of items needed include flood buckets, school kits, healthcare kits, and kitchen kits.
 - Since we already committed to sending items to LWR through the end of this year, we can continue as planned this year. Next year we will send items to the NALC Disaster Response Fund.
 - o If the Piecemakers would still like to send quilts to LWR, they may choose to do so.
 - o Pastor Cauble encourages people to go to the NALC Disaster Response collection events.
- 2024 Proposed Budget
 - The Finance Committee met Tuesday, September 28 to prepare a budget for 2024. The motion came from the Finance Committee to accept the 2024 proposed budget. The motion was seconded by Danny Sorrells. Following a review of line items, changes (increases or decreases, if any), specified categories and suggestions/concerns, the budget was accepted unanimously as amended. [Current: \$236,515.00; Benevolence: \$34,700.00; Building: \$10,000.00; TOTAL BUDGET: \$281,215.00]
 - The Council-approved 2024 Budget is to be distributed to the congregation by the first Sunday in November and will be voted on at the Annual Congregational Meeting (3rd Sunday, November 19).
