## THE PASTOR'S PEN THE SEASON OF EASTER

The Easter Season, this year, begins on March 31, 2024, Easter Sunday. But Easter is not merely a one-day celebration; it is a fifty-day season from the Day of Resurrection (March 31) to the Day of Pentecost (May 19). This extended season lasts for seven weeks or seven Sundays. It is a time of celebration for our Lord who overcame death and the grave. This year, we will celebrate Easter by having Holy Communion offered every Sunday in the Easter Season. As recorded in the Pastoral Desk Diary 2024, "the colors of Easter are white and gold. White, the color of our Lord's holiness, is everywhere on Easter, from the paraments and vestments to the traditional Easter lilies. Gold decorations remind us that our resurrection life in Christ is precious and eternal." After not saying or singing Alleluia for the forty days of Lent, this great word of exultation returns to our worship life in The Hymn of Praise, and our hymns in general. We also return to singing the Psalm and the Second Hymn. Also, do not forget the special Easter greeting and response: "CHRIST IS RISEN!" "HE IS RISEN INDEED! ALLELUIA!"

WHAT IS A PARAMENT? A parament is a cloth or tapestry hanging used to adorn the space of worship, especially those hangings at the altar, pulpit, and lectern. The term is derived from the Latin, "to decorate" or "prepare."

In the Lutheran Church, we have <u>six seasons</u> of the church year. They are as follows with the color of paraments used:

Advent – blue Christmas – white Epiphany – green Lent – purple Easter – white Pentecost – green

James (Jimmy) Sherrill IV of Dallas, NC (and grandson of Senior Friends member Libby Mauney) provided our informative program on "Outsmarting the Scammers." He is a Financial Advisor with Edward Jones. After a brief introduction regarding charitable distributions, required minimum distributions (at age 73+), estate planning, etc. Jimmy shared an enlightening packet of number facts, scenarios of potential scammer techniques, red flags and ways to avoid these pitfalls. Throughout his presentation, many members shared personal experiences with scammers and stressed ways to avoid these problems. Discussed the emerging of AI (Artificial Intelligence) and its possible link to scams.

## **Student and Family Ministries**





#### Congregation $+/\Delta$ :

Several members have mentioned that the church has not been cleaned very well, specifically the restrooms and the Sanctuary. Congregation members are coming to clean the church. It may be time to review the janitorial job description with G&M Maintenance. We also need to consider the fact that we are only paying them \$495 per month. It may be that we would have to pay more to get everything done that we consider necessary. Robert will send data from the county to John about how many hours per square foot should be spent on cleaning. BJ has a friend who cleans churches and will ask her how much she charges and whether she charges by the hour or by square footage. The Property Committee will then reach out to G&M Maintenance to review their contract.

#### **Old Business:**

- Automatic Door Opener Update
  - The automatic door opener has been installed.
  - o Robert is going to add about 15 seconds to the hold open time.
- Outdoor Worship Area Update
  - Rusty emailed the City of Hickory about when we would receive the grant money. They said they
    would find out more in 3-4 weeks.
  - We have spoken with a civil engineer, Dan Shabeldeen. He is interested in working with the people doing the work. He would design a plan and then we would have to apply for permits before the work could begin.
  - The city will eventually give us a check for \$100,000. There is no draw process.
  - Rusty spoke with Senator Proctor and told him we appreciated his efforts on our behalf. Senator
     Proctor asked that we keep him in the loop if we had any problems.
- Barbara Hamrick payroll
  - Robert spoke with Barbara and she agreed that we could collect a love offering to help cover the cost of the 1099 employer taxes she must pay.

  - Vicki Cauble said she would be interested in representing New Jerusalem as our Carolinas Mission
     Region Convocation delegate. Pastor Cauble made a motion to elect Vicki Cauble as our delegate.
     Danny Sorrells seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.
- New Vacuum Cleaner
  - Since Megan now has an office upstairs and other activities have increased, Danny Sorrells asked to purchase a new vacuum cleaner for that area. Council approved.

#### Ministries: (Pastor is a member of all committees):

Cemetery Committee (John Lutz and Rusty Lutz)

Columbarium

- We have a solution for how to bore the holes for the columbarium in the future. For now, we have hired someone to repair the niche that was damaged.
- o Kathy Lail was very pleased with what was done for Mike's niche.
- We currently have 13 niches available in the columbarium and 58 plots available in the cemetery. 12
   of those plots are single plots and 46 could accommodate a husband and wife.
- We will need more space in the future. When we get down to a certain number of spaces left in the columbarium, we will need to order another one.
- We have received a quote for \$16,000 for a 48-niche columbarium from the same company who installed the one at Bethlehem Lutheran.

#### Property Committee (Danny Black and John Lutz)

- The Church Grounds Workday is scheduled for this Saturday. It is supposed to rain. John may try to call people and reschedule it for Friday.
- John received a request to improve the lighting in the Adult Assembly Room. Since the electrician was already here installing the electronic door, John asked him to work on the lights as well. The electrician increased the number of fluorescent lights and changed them to LEDs.

#### Fellowship Committee (Karen Teague) -

• The Fellowship Committee worked with Women's Group 1 to sponsor the March birthday celebration. The ladies from Group 1 said that they appreciated the help.

#### Finance and Stewardship Committee (Deron Bumgarner)

- Youth & Family Expenses
  - With the complexity of sharing the cost of Megan's salary and youth events with St. Martin's, the
     Finance Committee recommends spending the remaining balance from the youth account and then
     pulling future expenses from Current Available.
  - Next year the budgeted line item in the Current Fund would increase to include more than just the mission trip.
  - Danny Black made a motion to spend the remaining balance from the youth account and pull any additional expenses from Current Available. Danny Sorrells seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.
  - o Is there a limit to what Megan can spend without council approval?
    - Reimbursements have a cap of \$500, but may be adjustable for trips and other things.
    - We need to decide how big projects are budgeted since we split costs with St. Martin's. Currently, all expenses are coming to New Jerusalem and St. Martin's reimburses us (salary and activities).
    - Megan can make a recommendation to the Finance Committee each year during budget planning based on the activities she has planned for the following year.
    - A credit card for Megan was approved at the February council meeting, but no limit was discussed. Robert Hoyle made a motion to set the credit card's limit to \$2,000. Rusty Lutz seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.
    - We will request that Megan to do a budget with St. Martin's for 2025 spending when the time comes so that we are all on the same page.

#### <u>Learning</u>, Youth, and Family Committee (Lisa Cook, Robert Hoyle, and Jan Sorrells)

We may consider paying to have this done once per month to ease the burden on the volunteers who are currently mowing.

- We will meet this month or early next month to plan a joint event with Megan for Disaster Relief collection.

- We are planning for Holy Week and Easter services.
- We will have communion every Sunday of the Easter season. In the future, when paraments are white, we will have communion. This is in addition to the 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Sundays.
