October 14, 2024

The October 2024 Church Council meeting was held October 14, 2024. All members of Church Council were in attendance except Deron Bumgarner, Lisa Cook, Robert Hoyle, and John Lutz. The meeting was called to order by President Ken Temple who also led devotions. Rusty Lutz will lead the devotions in November. Ken Temple was council designate in September and stated that everything went well. The minutes for the council meeting held September 9, 2024, were approved as written.

One meeting with the Lutheran House of Studies Advisory Board at Gordon-Conwell Seminary in Charlotte.

Congregational sympathy was extended to the family of The Rev. Harvey Blume who died on October 1, 2024. His memorial service was held at New Jerusalem on Monday, October 14, 2024. Pastor Blume was buried at Oakdale Cemetery in Hickory.

I am excited to see our numbers in Sunday school growing. Providing a new and exciting form of Sunday school for our children is making a difference. Please continue to encourage parents to bring their little ones to Sunday school and worship.

I am preparing for my surgery which takes place on Tuesday, November 12 at Baptist Hospital in Winston-Salem. I will probably be out of work for two to three weeks if all goes well. Pastor Steve Johnson will be leading worship and preaching in my absence. He will also be on standby for pastoral needs in the congregation. I greatly appreciate his willingness to help.

The fourth Life-to-Life Discipleship class started in September. We have eight people taking the course.

Homecoming was held on the 29th of September. It was a great success. Thank you to everyone who helped make it so. Thank you for all that you continue to do.

- Several people have mentioned that Paula Hopper has been doing a really good job keeping things clean.
- Betty Scipione mentioned the need for a leaf blower. There were acorns on the ramp that needed to be removed before Pastor Harvey Blume's funeral so that it wasn't a hazard for people to walk. Paula has brought her own, but it would be nice to have one at the church. Betty was asked to mention this request to the Property Committee.

Old Business:

- Outdoor Worship Area Update
 - \circ We turned in our 3rd quarter report with one invoice for the grading.
 - We have received an engineer's drawing to do the repair work.
 - We forwarded the limited power of attorney giving permission to Dan Shabeldeen to obtain the necessary permits.
 - We don't know if the destruction in the mountains will hinder our original timeline for repairs.
 - Ken reviewed the constitution and stated that there should be a congregational meeting if the cost of the project is over 10% of the current budget. However, after council discussion, it was decided that no meeting is necessary because the money was not contributed by the congregation. It would only become an issue if the project goes over the granted amount.
 - \circ $\;$ Updates are available in the newsletter.

New Business:

- Loose Offering (Got \$2,000 from Carris Reels \$1,000 from Operation Christmas Child and \$1,000 for Thanksgiving Box Meals). Would like to see some physical contributions. BJ recommended Thanksgiving Box Meals. Found out we had more than
 - November 3 Youth and Family Ministry of NJLC
 - November 10 Thanksgiving Box Meals
 - November 17 Thanksgiving Box Meals
 - November 24 Thanksgiving Box Meals
- Union Anglican Church request
 - Aaron Morrison of the Union Anglican Church in Morganton would like to use a Sunday school room every other Saturday for 2-5 of their members from the Hickory area to meet and pray. They would meet for about an hour and a half.
 - Pastor Cauble would like to meet with him personally along with another member of council.
 - Council asked what time they would meet and whether or not this was indefinite.
 - It was mentioned that we could get the Scout Hut keyed differently from the rest of the church. They could then use it after Pastor Cauble and another council member met with him and felt comfortable with them using the space.

Ministries: (Pastor is a member of all committees):

<u>Cemetery Committee</u> (John Lutz and Rusty Lutz):

• There is a meeting planned for the first Sunday in November at 8:30 am in the Adult Assembly Room.

Property Committee (Danny Black and John Lutz):

- One tree fell during the storm. John got it cut down and out of the way.
- The Nursery Committee has given input about the carpet samples that were brought. They suggested a carpet that would require an increase of \$504.42 over the quote that was approved last month (\$2630.70 for the nursery and \$1,869.72 for the stairs) for a total of \$4,500.42. Danny Sorrells made a motion to increase the approved amount for the carpet by \$504.42. Rusty Lutz seconded the motion. *The motion passed unanimously.*

Fellowship Committee (Karen Teague) – No meeting.

Finance and Stewardship Committee (Deron Bumgarner)

- Adult Assembly Room Copier
 - A desktop copier to replace the current copier in the Adult Assembly Room would cost \$2,102.03 if purchased through Xerox. The maintenance fee would be \$25.80 per month for up to 2,000 pages.
 - A question was raised about other options such as purchasing one from Office Depot. If we purchased a desktop copier from a store, someone would have to keep up with its maintenance.
 - Rusty made a motion to remove the copier from the Adult Assembly Room and ask members to call Kristy in advance to make copies. Pastor Cauble seconded the motion. *The motion passed unanimously.*
 - \circ $\;$ Kristy will call Xerox and ask how to dispose of the old copier.
- 2025 Proposed Budget
 - The Finance Committee met Tuesday, September 24 to prepare a budget for 2025. Proposed budgets for Current, Benevolence, and Building were reviewed.
 - o Current
 - The motion came from the Finance Committee to accept the 2025 proposed Current Fund budget. The motion was seconded by Rusty Lutz. Following a review of line items, council suggested an increase of \$375 in the Youth Director Salary (a 2% increase). The proposed Current Fund budget was accepted unanimously as amended (\$254,585.00).
 - o Benevolence
 - The total budget recommended by the Finance Committee was \$34,700.00. The only potential change recommended was to possibly remove CRU (Matt and Sabrina Pursley) from the budget and increase the budget for Brian and Alle McClure by that amount. Ken will reach out to Matt and Sabrina and ask them for a report. If they are still active, the line items can remain the same as last year. Either way, the total Benevolence budget would remain the same.
 - The motion came from the Finance Committee to accept the 2025 proposed Benevolence Fund budget of \$34,700.00. BJ Morgan seconded the motion. *The motion passed unanimously.*
 - o Building
 - The motion came from the Finance Committee to accept the 2025 proposed Building Fund budget of \$10,000. Danny Sorrells seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.
 - The total proposed budget is as follows: Current: \$254,585.00; Benevolence: \$34,700.00; Building: \$10,000.00; TOTAL BUDGET: \$299,285
 - The Council-approved 2025 Budget is to be distributed to the congregation by the first Sunday in November and will be voted on at the Annual Congregational Meeting (3rd Sunday, November 17).
 - Note: The suggested amount to pay supply pastors has increased to \$250 plus \$50 if there is an additional service. The mileage cost is set by the government and is currently 67 cents per mile.

Learning, Youth, and Family Committee (Lisa Cook, Robert Hoyle, and Jan Sorrells)

• A committee meeting with St. Martin's was held September 8, a meeting with confirmation parents was held September 15, and the New Jerusalem Family Life and Sunday School Committee met October 6.

- Faith Builders' rotational Sunday School kicked off on Sunday, September 8. In September, the kids learned about creation. In October, they are learning about Noah's Ark.
- Confirmation began October 13 with 16 students.
- Upcoming Events
 - Kids of the Kingdom will meet October 20, November 17, and December 15. We are looking for leaders to help with this.
 - Fall Festival and Trunk-or-Treat will be held November 2 at New Jerusalem.
 - Christ the King Bonfire is a family event that will be held at Howard and Reba Reinhardt's house to be a central location for both churches (either November 23 or 24).
- A monthly newsletter for youth and family ministry has been created and will go out to all those who want it.

Long Range Planning Committee (Rusty Lutz and Danny Sorrells) -

- Met twice since the last council meeting.
- Continued to review 2021 Strategic Plan. One suggestion was to form another strategic planning committee since the last one was planned in 2020 and approved in 2021. It will be 5 years old in 2026.
- Other brainstorming ideas were to open an early childhood education and family life center, reinstate blood drives, support mission opportunities for our youth, get more people involved in witnessing, train the congregation for Stevens Ministry, and get monitors to display the announcements before the service and to display the service so that non-Lutheran visitors can better follow the service.
- We would also like to continue looking for ways to work with the community in outreach projects. We appreciate the Newton Elks Lodge partnership with the Operation Christmas Child project.

Service Committee (BJ Morgan and Karen Teague)

- The food order for the Thanksgiving Box Meals will be placed this week with Food Lion in Mt. View.
- The Angel Tree will be up by the end of October. We will have 50 names (25 names of local children and 25 names of children from Loris).
- Our goal is to pack 150 boxes for Operation Christmas Child. We have enough money for the shipping between donations from the Elks Lodge and Carris Reels. We now need donations of items to pack in the boxes. National Collection Week is November 17-25.

Witness Committee (Betty Scipione and Ken Temple) – No report.

Worship Committee (Pastor Cauble and Betty Scipione) - No report.
