As we enter the Pentecost Season, let us be reminded of our need to continue to be active in the church, through our attendance, activity, and giving. We know and can rest assured that the church does not close its doors or take a vacation during the summer. We are still here providing Word and Sacrament, the essentials of our spiritual growth. 

NJLC Senior Friends monthly meeting was held on Wed., May 21 at 11:30 with **32 people present** (26 members and 6 guests). We recognized our May Birthdays and Anniversary. Pastor Orovitz shared the meal prayer.

Following the meal, Teresa Vanderlinden presented the devotions. Also being circulated were our Thinking of you cards and a sign-up for our Friday, June 13 trip to Daniel Boone Inn for breakfast.

The Piece Makers (Quilting Committee) briefly shared their history. Sponsored by the NJ Luth. Women, the Piece Makers organized on Mar. 1, 2016 and first met at the home of their

"Leader" Connie Bumgarner. Thanks to the hard work of various individuals, they then established the quilting room upstairs in the Fellowship Building. They noted that they were not the first quilting group at NJLC. On Nov. 17, 1905 women held their first meeting and organized a Ladies Aid Society for raising funds for furnishing the new church. Some of their fund raising was done through the sale of guilts they made. They shared a photo of some of the quilters from the 1960's and 70's. There are now seven Piece Makers and we are proud to carry on their legacy of service. Between 2016 and 2024, the Piece Makers have made 386 guilts for Luth. World Relief & NALC Disaster Relief. The first quilt they presented as a gift was the "Tree of Life" in 2016: Honoring Pastor Cauble's 25 years at NJLC & 30 years as an ordained minister. Other highlights, such as banners/quilts for the church, Quilts of Valor (for Veterans), baptismal guilts, etc. were shared and in closing, each household

received a jar gripper made by the Piece Makers.

Church Council Meeting Minutes

May 12, 2025

(Motions are in **BOLD** and Actions are *Italicized*)

The May 2025 Church Council meeting was held May 12, 2025. All members of Church Council were in attendance except Deron Bumgarner, Cindy Coulter, Thad Scronce, and Karen Teague. The meeting was called to order by President Ken Temple who led devotions in Deron Bumgarner's absence. Callie Southers will lead the devotions in June. Robert Hoyle was council designate in April and stated that he enjoyed serving and was able to talk to some new people. The minutes for the council meeting held April 14, 2025, were approved as presented.

<u>Treasurer Reports</u> were received as information and show the following month end balances.

Pastor Cauble Update:

Pastor Cauble has several upcoming appointments, one of which is to enable him to have dialysis at home. After this is in place and he sees how he feels, he will be able to make a decision as to when he will return. This decision will most likely be made by the first of July.

A motion was brought from the Finance Committee for the church to continue paying for Hahn insurance until Pastor Cauble has supplemental and prescription plans in place. Rusty Lutz seconded the motion. *The motion passed unanimously.*

Pastor's Report to Council:

- Wade and J.B. Shannon were baptized Sunday, May 11.
- Bob Bekemeier's mother-in-law, Arlene Machamer, would like to join our congregation. Pastor Steve
 Johnson made a motion to accept Arlene Machamer as a new member. Robert Hoyle seconded the
 motion. The motion passed unanimously.
- The Outdoor Chapel will be rededicated soon.
- Kylee Queen and Liam Robinson will present their confirmation projects during the service Sunday, May 25.
- Pastor Doug Hefner is now our Catawba Valley District youth coordinator.
- Grace Lutheran Church will hold day camp this summer.
- Mission Region convocation -
 - A constitutional amendment that defines who attends the convocation and defines their roles passed at the regional convocation; however, a majority of congregations must also approve the change.

- If approved, every congregation will get 2 lay delegates regardless of the size of the congregation.
 Furthermore, clergy would represent the ministerium (or full body of the clergy) rather than their individual congregations.
- We will have a congregational meeting to vote on this amendment before September.
- In addition, the region is asking to change the way individual congregations support the operating budget. In the past, the budget was totaled and then divided by the number of congregations.
 They will now ask congregations to support the mission region with 1% of their general fund contributions.

 - The counters in the kitchen were sticky. Kristy will write an announcement for the bulletin and newsletter about keeping the kitchen clean after each use.

Old Business:

- Support of new missionary
 - o Ken spoke with Nate Watters about his ministry.
 - Ken will send a link to his website and the notes that he has taken to council members for their review. Nate is also willing to come to NC to share with our congregation.
 - Discussion will continue at the next meeting after council members have had time to review this
 information.
- Outdoor Worship
 - \$233 was left of the grant from the state. John got extra gravel. The total went over by a few hundred dollars.

New Business:

- Loose Offering
 - June 1 Youth and Family Ministry of NJLC
 - Remaining Sundays in June NALC Disaster Relief designated to NC.
- Family Life Center Donations
 - There are two accounts that contain donations for the Family Life Center. The Edward Jones
 account contains stocks that were gifted through a memorial. There is a designated account
 within the Current Fund that reflects donations made through regular Sunday offerings.
 - The Finance Committee was asked to investigate the possibility of combining the funds from the Current Fund into a single Edward Jones account.
 - Kristy was asked to combine the two numbers for the council minutes so that the total amount donated to the Family Life Center is reflected.
