From the Pastor's Desk

Our Kairos Weekend in Foothills CI was amazing. God was at work and changed many lives. The participants (inmates) were moved by the “Agape” we shared, signs of unconditional love: the prayer wheels with your names and others from around the country, the placemats made by children of our churches, the letters from the team members and the posters from other prisons around the country and the world. They were moved by our unconditional love and the prayers and gifts of people who did not know them. “Why do they care,” they asked. “Because God our Father loves you and they want you to know that and have eternal life,” was our answer. One gentleman shared the reason he wanted to come to Kairos was because he saw other inmates who had been to a Kairos Weekend come back with a peace and joy they wanted. They found it. Sharing the love of Jesus is not as hard as you think. The witness team will be offering three 2-hour sessions to help you practice sharing God’s love with others who are hurting, or who have been away from God and the church, or who have questions about faith and Jesus. We haven’t set a date or time, but will coordinate with a few other churches so more of our disciples can practice together and gain confidence sharing the good news of Jesus. We will learn what not to say and how to listen more carefully and really hear what people are sharing with us. I hope you will take advantage of this offering to build your own faith and be a more confident witness to Jesus. We will combine information from “Ministering to Inactive Members” by Rev. Kenneth Haugk and “Evangelism Saturation Training” by Rev. Don Abdon. Watch for more information, times and locations.

From the Call Committee

Dear Church Family,

The Call Committee is excited to introduce a new section in our church newsletter. We will keep you informed here with monthly updates, in addition to announcements and temple talks where we will also share information along the way.

We are following the NALC's call process, which is a bit different from what our church has done in the past. As part of this process, we are creating a church profile that will be posted on the NALC website, where prospective pastors can learn more about our congregation. Interested pastors will reach out to the Call Process Coordinator, Rev. Shelly Schultz, who will then connect them with our Call Committee. We are currently working on completing this profile.

You can be part of this process by sending photos of church events and groups to NJLCcallcommittee@gmail.com. These pictures will help us share the heart of our church with those who are considering a call to serve here. A key part of this process is also maintaining confidentiality regarding interested pastors, which helps protect both them and the congregations they are currently serving.

We would also like to share that the Call Committee has carefully reviewed and compiled the results from the recent congregational survey. This feedback will help guide us as we move forward in our search. Thank you to everyone who took the time to complete a survey—we are grateful for your support and involvement. Congregational Survey Results:

Question #1: What do you believe God is calling our church to focus on in the next 5-10 years?

The written responses to question #1 revealed three clear themes. First, many members believe the church is being called to focus on growth, especially by attracting and supporting children, youth, young adults, and young families. Second, there was a strong desire for greater outreach and community involvement, with members emphasizing the importance of being more welcoming, visible, and connected to those outside the church. Finally, respondents consistently highlighted the need for continued spiritual growth and discipleship, stressing that any future growth should remain firmly rooted in Scripture, faith, and caring relationships within the congregation.

Question #2: In your view, how would you rate each of New Jerusalem's actions listed below? (strengths & challenges)

The highest-rated strength by far was being a spiritually mature congregation, with 73.2% of respondents identifying that as a strength. Following that, respondents named strong community and fellowship (61%), and active worship and music programs (56.1%) as strengths.

The strongest concern was youth and young adult growth, with 90.5% naming it as a challenge, followed closely by community outreach at 85.7%. Supporting families and children was also a concern at 64.3%.

Question #3: Our call committee believes God will lead our congregation to a new NALC pastor that is Christ-centered, mission-driven, congregationally focused, and traditionally grounded. We also understand, for our next Pastor, there are additional qualities and characteristics that are important to you. From the list please select only 5, ranking them 1 through 5 with 1 being the most important.

When members ranked the qualities they most wanted in a new pastor, the congregation placed the greatest emphasis on strong biblical teaching and preaching. Members also highly valued a pastor who is compassionate, personally involved with members through visiting, and able to connect Scripture to the challenges of today's world.

These traits ranked in importance to our congregation as follows.

- Strong biblical knowledge and teaching ability
- Clear, engaging preaching
- Compassionate and caring
- Invested in visiting
- Ability to apply Scripture to today's culture

It is worth noting that several other traits were closely ranked as well with "Approachable and Personable" basically tying for 5th place and "Has a passion for youth and family" in a close 6th place.

Question #4: How open are you to changes or new initiatives under a new pastor?

The majority of respondents are open to change under a new pastor. Over half (53.5%) indicated they are somewhat open, meaning they support changes that align with the church's mission and values. Another 30.2% are very open and excited for new ideas and approaches. A smaller portion (14%) feel neutral, depending on the situation, while only a very small percentage expressed caution or resistance to change.

Question #5: What key advice would you give to the call committee?

Responses emphasized the importance of selecting a pastor who is engaging, relational, and a strong communicator, with a focus on dynamic preaching and connecting with both youth and older members. Many highlighted the need for thoughtful, gradual change that respects existing traditions while still moving the church forward, including openness to new ideas like technology use and expanded ministries. There was also interest in a younger pastor with long-term potential, as well as a desire for transparency, congregational involvement, and clear communication throughout the call process. Additionally, some responses noted preferences for specific ministry priorities, such as service times, outreach, and maintaining a welcoming environment for all, including retired pastors.

The Worship Committee will need to review wedding guidelines by the next council meeting. *The motion passed unanimously.*

 - Mt. Olive in Viewmont has a traditional sanctuary and uses screens. Rusty would be glad to go view it if anyone is interested.
 - To use screens, we would need someone willing to manage them weekly.
- New treasurer to be trained. Wayne has ideas.
- **Robert Hoyle made a motion for Dennis and Kay Weaver to be our delegates for the Carolinas Mission Region Convocation May 1-2 and the National Convention by Zoom in August.** Don Barger seconded the motion. *The motion was approved unanimously.*

New Business:

- CRU – Kevin and Jennifer Williams
 - Kevin came and spoke to us about his ministry through CRU at UNC Charlotte.
- The NALC requests that churches hold a National Response Sunday when a special offering would be received. We will pick a Sunday in September.
- A congregation member suggested receiving a Love offering for one Sunday in October for the Current Fund. This decision will be postponed in light of updated Current Fund information.

Ministries: (Pastor is a member of all committees):

Long Range Planning (Rusty Lutz):

- Our quarterly meeting was held and was well attended. Our next quarterly meeting will be held in June.
- There will be a meeting with the congregation in August. This is the time to submit budget requests for the Finance Committee.

Cemetery Committee (Rusty Lutz):

- The McCombs marker was installed. All markers are now updated.

Property Committee (Thad Scronce/Donald Barger):

- See above discussion about the stained glass Gethsemane window.
- The Spring cleanup day went well.

Fellowship Committee (Hans Robinson):

- Met Sunday, April 12.
 - Looking at options for Mother's Day gifts.
 - Discussed providing a meal confirmation class Sunday, May 17.
 - A "working" lunch will be held in the near future to nail down dates/details of events the Fellowship Committee is responsible for.
- We have two high school graduates (Thomas Helms and Kate Reid) and two college graduates (Charlie Hoyle and Landon Scronce).

Finance and Stewardship Committee (Alan Bolch/Garret Turbyfill):

- Edward Jones CDs:
 - Brokered CDs with Edward Jones matured and a decision needs to be made regarding how to proceed. CDs must be purchased in increments of \$1,000. Matured CDs earned 4% interest.
 - The Finance Committee recommends reinvesting the original amounts (\$50,000 into a Current Fund CD and \$15,000 in a Cemetery Fund CD) and using the interest to deposit into separate money market accounts at 3.5%.
 - Garret recommended investing \$20,000 into a Cemetery CD (leaving \$6,000 in the Cemetery Fund). Garret also recommended moving some money from the Building Fund to an Edward Jones CD.
 - **Garret Turbyfill made a motion to invest in CDs for the following amounts: \$50,000 in a Current Fund CD, \$20,000 in a Cemetery Fund CD, and \$120,000 in a Building Fund CD at 3.9% for 9 months. The interest from the maturing Current and Cemetery CDs will be moved to separate Money Market Accounts.** Cindy Coulter seconded. *The motion passed unanimously.*
 - Alan will speak with Wayne and Billy.
 - The interest from the Cemetery Fund CDs may eventually grow to where they could fund the Cemetery mowing.

Learning, Youth, and Family Committee (Callie Southers):

- The Easter egg hunt was really successful. Callie expressed appreciation for all the help received from other committees.
- Tentative date for Confirmation is June 7.

Service Committee (BJ Morgan):

- BJ expressed appreciation to Glenda Shook for delivering our food donations. We donated 22 pounds this month. Donations are a little low. We would like to see 50 pounds. Kristy will write a note to put in the bulletin.

Witness Committee (Robert Hoyle and Ken Temple):

- Meeting Tuesday, April 21 at 7:00 pm in the Gathering Room.

Worship Committee (Cindy Coulter/Jack Robinson):

- Met March 10 to finalize plans for Easter season.
- The Seder meal was successful. Over 70 people were in attendance. It was noted that the choir sounded wonderful and that the lamb was excellent.
- Student protection plan - Megan is going to show the required video at the next meeting. Once that is done, Robert will send a roster to the insurance company.
- Meeting Thursday, May 7, at 6:30 pm. We will review the wedding guidelines and add details about use of the waterfalls.
